Carl A. Cira is director of the Summit of the Americas Center at Florida International University. Before joining FIU he worked in Latin America with the US Agency for International Development, most recently as mission director in Bogotá. From 1993 to 1997 he directed USAID’s Office of Democratic Initiatives in La Paz, Bolivia, heading a politically sensitive program for law and state reform that helped build Bolivia’s democratic institutions and expand human rights protections. Mr. Cira also served for 12 years with the US Justice Department’s antitrust division and was deputy chief of its foreign commerce section. His academic experience includes positions as senior research scholar at FIU’s School of Public Affairs and Services and as adjunct law professor at Georgetown University, where he also was executive director of the International Law Institute. He holds a J.D. from Boston College Law School.

Argemiro Ferreira is the New York correspondent for “GloboNews,” Rede Globo’s 24-hour news cable station, as well as for *Tribuna da Imprensa*, Portuguese TV’s “Jornal de Notícias” and several French radio stations. He has been an international journalist for more than 40 years, working for such newspapers as *O Globo*, *Jornal do Brasil*, *Correio da Manhã*, *O Jornal* and *O Dia*, and the magazine *Manchete*. He is former vice president of the Journalists’ Union in Rio de Janeiro and the author of several books, including a forthcoming one about President Bush’s war policy.

Donna Hrinak is a former US ambassador to Brazil. She recently retired from the US Foreign Service and will join Steel Hector & Davis as a senior consultant for international trade and government affairs. She previously served as ambassador to Venezuela, Bolivia and the Dominican Republic and as deputy assistant secretary for inter-American affairs. She held additional diplomatic posts in Honduras, Colombia, Poland and Mexico. In Washington, she worked as regional affairs officer for Central America. She has received the US government’s Distinguished Public Service Award and the Department of State’s Superior and Meritorious Honor Awards, as well as a Congressional Fellowship from the American Political Science Association. Ms. Hrinak graduated from Michigan State University and attended George Washington University and the University of Notre Dame School of Law.

Christian Lohbauer is international relations manager at the Federation and Center of Industries of the State of São Paulo, Brazil (Fiesp/Ciesp). He holds a PhD in political science from the University of São Paulo. He is a member of the International Relations Analysis Group at the University of São Paulo and teaches at different institutions.

Ken Roberts is the founding publisher of WorldCity Inc., a Coral Gables-based media company with a monthly magazine, three annual trade-related publications, a multinational directory and CD, and a monthly multinational forum. He has served as a director or advisor on a number of boards, including those focused on the international business community in South Florida. In 2004, he was one of about 60 US business leaders chosen by the US Department of Defense to tour Asia as part of the Joint Civilian Orientation Conference. Prior to starting WorldCity, Roberts was the founding publisher of *South Florida Parenting* and a reporter and editor at a number of newspapers, including the *Miami Herald* and the *Tampa Tribune*. He graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1981.
